

SUPPLY LIST FOR WATERCOLOR CLASS

PAINTS: Whenever possible, buy the best quality you can afford – Get Professional grade , NOT student grade or the Cotman line. DaVinci and Holbein are of good quality and will serve you well for this course, Daniel Smith and Winsor Newton are also good. Every art supply catalog will have a variety of brands. Suzy's experience has taught her what works best and she recommends certain brands in the lists below when they make a difference! The colors needed for good success in this class are:

- Aureolin Yellow – Holbein or DaVinci – (Winsor Newton has a greenish tint)
- Burnt Sienna
- Ultra Marine Blue – also called French Ultra Marine Blue
- Cobalt Blue by DaVinci
- Antwerp Blue by Winsor Newton
- Cerulean Blue
- Veridian
- Quinacridon Red
- Quinacridon Rose (in place of Alizarin Crimson) Permanent Rose or Rose Madder will work as well
- Quinacridon Gold
- Lemon Yellow (Cadmium) by DaVinci
- Opera -by Holbein
- Hookers Green
- Sap Green by DaVinci
- Paynes Grey

BRUSHES – if you own brushes, by all means, bring them. If you need brushes, here is a basic list:

- #6 Round Golden Fleece (or brand of your choice)
- #10 Round Golden Fleece – or ""
- ½ " Flat – buy a good one, if possible – Winsor Newton Series 995 is nice
- #1 Rigger – Golden Fleece, or your choice
- 1 ½ " flat wash brush - a large brush to get a lot of liquid onto paper fast
- Set of Fritch Scrubbers – available from Cheap Joe's – these are the "erasers" of watercolor

Also

- A Cat's Tongue Brush is a highly recommended and very desirable. Although a bit pricy, it is a work horse that will serve you well for many years. In Cheap Joe's catalog there is a Black Velvet 1" oval brush featured on page 154.. Suzy calls this her "go to" brush and it is central to her collection of brushes.

PAPER: Paper will be covered by my materials fee. Student should bring a sketch book , 8x10 Or 9x12 will be fine or whatever you already have at home.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS:

#2 pencils

Mat Knife

Kneaded Eraser

Paper Towels – Viva preferred b/c they last

Natural sponge if you have it – if not, Suzy and I have some to share

Water containers – these can be plastic cottage cheese type containers or those nice clear containers you get at the deli counter – whatever you have that will hold water and not take up too much space – two should be sufficient

Mister or spray bottle – this is important
